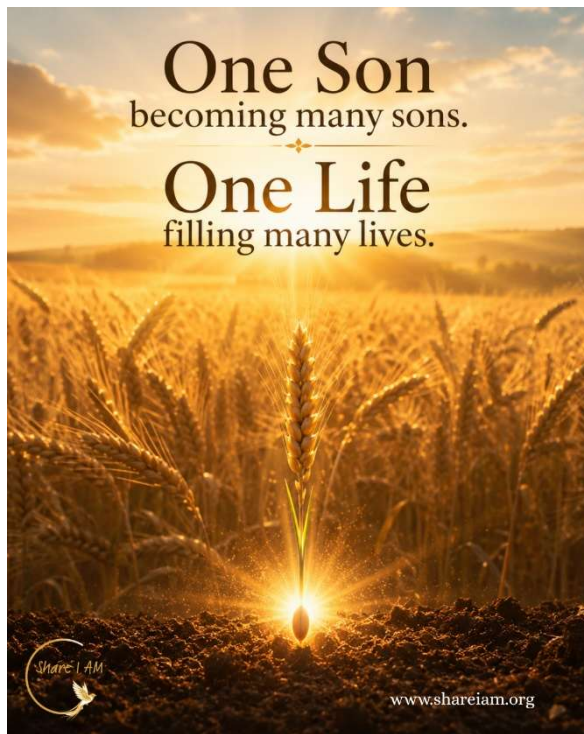




SONS OF THE KINGDOM, A GLORIOUS INHERITANCE

Read Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43.

📖 *“The field is the world, the good seeds are the sons of the kingdom.” Matthew 13:38*

One of the quiet tragedies of Christian living is that many believers live far beneath their true title. We know we are forgiven, we know we are saved, yet we often **fail to grasp** what we have **become**. Scripture does not merely call us servants, or even children, but **sons of the Kingdom**. This is not poetic language. It is identity. It is inheritance.

Jesus explains that the Son of Man Himself is the Sower, and the seed He sows is not doctrine, but **people**. He first sowed Himself.

“Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it produces much grain” (John 12:24). Christ did not come merely to teach humanity about God; He came to **reproduce** His own life within humanity. The **Son of God** became the **Son of Man** so that **sons of men** might become **sons of God**.

When the Greeks said, *“Sir, we wish to see Jesus,”* (John 12:21), Jesus did not point to a sermon or a system. He spoke of death and multiplication. True spiritual maturity is not found in religious brilliance, but in **Christ being formed** within a **people**. As Paul writes, the goal is *“the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ”* (Ephesians 4:13). The world’s deepest cry remains unchanged: not *“show us religion,”* but *“show us Jesus.”*

This is why sonship is never about prominence. A seed does not draw attention to itself. It disappears into the soil. Sons of the Kingdom are planted, often unseen, stripped of reliance on what once sustained them, so that **divine life** may emerge where God has placed them. Where a son is planted, love begins to rule. Where a son takes root, the Kingdom becomes visible. The **Kingdom of God** speaks of who reigns. The Kingdom of heaven speaks of where that reign is expressed. Through sons, the unseen rule of God invades visible reality. This is how Christ is glorified, not merely seated in heaven, but **manifested in His offspring**. *“That He might be the firstborn among many brethren”* (Romans 8:29).

This is your inheritance. **One Son becoming many sons**. One Seed becoming many seeds. Christ reproduced in a people who **love God**, not striving for position, but yielding to purpose. The Son of Man is glorified when His nature lives again in you. *My little children, for whom I labor in birth again until Christ is formed in you.” Galatians 4:19*
