



THE THIRD DAY PEOPLE

📖 *"But, beloved, do not forget this one thing, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day." 2 Peter 3:8*

There are moments in history when heaven seems to draw nearer to earth, when the Spirit of God begins stirring hearts with the sense that **something greater** is unfolding beneath the surface of ordinary life. Scripture speaks prophetically of days and seasons, and many believe we are entering what may be called the "*Third Day*" since Christ's resurrection and the "*Seventh Day*" since creation, a season not merely of religious activity, but of **divine fullness**.

This is not simply another movement built on personalities, structures, or methods. God is preparing a **people** through whom Christ Himself may be **revealed**. The Lord is not merely raising louder voices, but **deeper** vessels; men and women marked by **surrender**, holiness, humility, and the fear of the Lord.

For too long the Church has often substituted information for **transformation**. Many delight in sermons, prophecies, teachings, and spiritual language, yet heaven seeks more than excitement over words. The world longs for **evidence** that the Kingdom of God is real. Creation itself groans for the manifestation of mature sons and daughters carrying the life of Christ within them (Romans 8:19).

The marvel of this coming work is not merely that leaders preach the message, but that they **become** the message. Like living letters written by Christ Himself (2 Corinthians 3:2-3), their lives bear **witness** to the reality of His Lordship. The Spirit is restoring reverence to His people, cleansing the Church from worldly compromise, and awakening a hunger not merely for spiritual experiences, but for Christ Himself.

Jesus declared, "*He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood abides in Me, and I in him*" (John 6:56). These words speak of far more than ritual. They reveal a people **feeding** daily upon the **Living Word** until His nature becomes their **nature**. As John the Baptist declared, "*He must increase, but I must decrease*" (John 3:30). The more deeply Christ is received within us, the more **self fades** and His glory emerges.

The Church will not remain imprisoned forever beneath fear, compromise, or human tradition. God is preparing a radiant **Bride**, clothed with His glory (Revelation 12:1). Not perfect through human effort, but transformed through **union** with Christ. The Spirit within us is the pledge of something far greater yet to come.

This generation does not merely need better methods. We need a **divine breakthrough**. We need Christ formed within His people until the world no longer encounters only our words, but His Life.
